

The Food Sector Specific SPA Safety Passport Course

About SPA

The Safety Pass Alliance (SPA) is a partnership of training providers specialising in passport training. They have joined forces to create a multi-industry health and safety training passport scheme. These industries include food, petrol retail and quarries. This health and safety training passport is similar to any passport. It allows access to a passport controlled work environment.

Introduction

At the heart of the SPA Safety Passport scheme is the core day, which involves training in seven key areas, to a level which everyone will understand. A delegate's understanding is assessed by multiple-choice questions and achievement is rewarded by the issue of a credit card sized "Safety Passport".

Through liaison with employer associations, trade unions, National Training Organisations (NTOs) and other relevant bodies, IOSH/SPA has designed and developed additional training modules tailored to different work sectors. These additional modules enhance the awareness of workers to their own related industries.

People who are in possession of a Client Contractor National Safety Group (ECITB/SCATS) safety passport gained within two years from the date of the SPA examination will not be required to attend day one (core day).

They will still be required to successfully complete day two. In such circumstances the CCNSG passport details must be enclosed with the candidate registration form and the passport itself brought in on day two of the SPA passport course for inspection and photocopying.

Course Content

The minimum course content is contained within the course training specification. The course takes two days to deliver, and includes a test at the end of each module.

The course covers eleven modules:

Day One

- Introduction to health and safety law, including safe systems of work
- 2 Workplace safety including access/egress, emergencies, vehicles and equipment
- 3 Fire Precautions and Procedures
- 4 Accidents –prevention and reporting and First Aid Procedures
- 5 Hazardous substances -COSHH and PPE
- 6 Manual Handling
- 7 Noise

Day Two

- 1 Scope of the Food Industry
- 2 Food Protection
- 3 Environmental Protection
- 4 Specific Food Sector health and safety problems

Retraining is required every three years.

Testing

At the end of each module, candidates must sit a 10 question multichoice examination paper. Over the entire course they must achieve a minimum 80% in order to pass. In addition in each core module there are "key" questions, which the candidate must answer correctly, failure to answer a key question correctly will result in module failure. The papers are marked and the candidates informed of the result. Incorrect answers will be discussed with the candidate

Should a candidate fail a module they may re-sit the module exam (maximum 4 attempts).

Candidates with dyslexia or any similar learning disability can be accommodated so long as the employer notifies BSS of any such problem at least two weeks prior to course commencement.

Subject to successfully passing this test, British Safety Services (BSS) will issue a temporary credit card sized certificate (passport) upon course completion, and SPA will issue a permanent passport within 25 working days. The certificate is the property of the employee - not the contractor. The certificate contains the delegate's name, expiry date of the passport (which is 3 years from the date of passing the test), and a card number.

Course Feedback

The course itself involves a significant amount of trainee participation. The content is something that most contractors know something about and some a great deal. Lively discussions normally ensue.

Fees

BSS charge, per person, £120.00 for the 2 day programme, plus £19.00 temporary and permanent passport fee. Places on the one-day refresher course, for candidates with either a current passport about to expire or one which expired no more than three months before the refresher date, cost £60.00. A full colour course delegate handout is included in the price.

In-house courses are available for a maximum number of 16 persons per course, a suitable venue to be provided by the client. For further details please contact BSS.

How to Book

Companies sending delegates on the course are required to pay course fees prior to attending the course. The maximum number of delegates is 16 per course.
